

#### A TRUE INSPIRATION


The students of Pre-primary celebrated Father's Day on Friday, the 16th of June 2023.

#### RAKSHA BANDHAN CELEBRATION




Raksha Bandhan was celebrated in the Pre-Primary Wing of National Public School, Chikkabanavara.

## **YOGA DAY**





### **INTER-HOUSE SPORTS COMPETITIONS**


















#### "Bridging Learning and Creativity Through Art"
